The Sigma Nu fraternity was founded Jan. 1, 1869, at the Virginia Military institute. The badge is of gold, with five white arms meeting in a center of black enamel, on which is coiled a golden serpent; each arm contains a pair of crossed swords and a Greek letter. The fraternity colors are black, white and gold.
